RESOLUTION #2015-22

"A Resolution opposing Assembly Bill 371/ Senate Bill 266 regarding Comprehensive Planning legislation"

WHEREAS, under current Wisconsin law, a Comprehensive Plan is a local

government's guide to community physical, social, and economic

development that provide a rational basis for local land use decisions with a

twenty-year vision for future planning and community decisions; and

WHEREAS, Comprehensive Plans require public participation at the local level in

deciding a vision for the community's future; and

WHEREAS, the uniqueness of individual Comprehensive Plans reflects community-

specific and locally driven planning processes; and

WHEREAS, beginning on January 1, 2010, if a town, village, city, or county enacts or

amends an official map, subdivision regulation, or zoning

ordinance, the enactment or amendment ordinance must be consistent with

that community's Comprehensive Plan; and

WHEREAS, Assembly Bill 371 / Senate Bill 266 would authorize a local government to

repeal its Comprehensive Plan and eliminate a grant program related to

Comprehensive Planning; and

WHEREAS, if local governmental units do not have local planning, a void is created that

could possibly be filled by top-down planning and land use regulation such as state agencies. Positions in boundary agreements, annexation, and other land

use issues with local and state agencies would be weakened,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Town of Cedarburg Town Board opposes Assembly Bill 371 / Senate Bill 266 to amend State Statutes regarding changes in Comprehensive Planning law.
