

**TOWN OF CEDARBURG
ORDINANCE NO. 2010-17**

**An Ordinance to Amend Chapter 273, Solid Waste
Town of Cedarburg Code of Ordinances, Ozaukee County, Wisconsin,
Relating to Refuse Collection and Recycling.**

The Town Board of the Town of Cedarburg, Wisconsin, do ordain as follows:

Chapter 273 of the Town of Cedarburg Code of Ordinances is hereby amended to read as follows:

§ 273-3. Definitions.

For the purpose of this article, the following words and phrases shall have the meaning given herein, unless different meanings are clearly indicated by the context:

AGRICULTURAL ESTABLISHMENT

An establishment engaged in the rearing and slaughtering of animals and the processing of animal products or orchard and field crops.

BULKY ITEMS

Items whose large size prevents placement in a refuse cart or precludes or complicates their handling by normal collection, processing or disposal methods.

COMMERCIAL UNIT

All structures except for single- and two-family homes.

CONSTRUCTION WASTES

That portion of solid wastes consisting of wastes from the repair, remodeling or reconstruction of buildings, such as lumber, roofing and sheathing scraps, rubble, broken concrete, asphalt and plaster, conduit, pipe, wire, insulation and any other materials resulting from the demolition of buildings and improvements.

DISPOSAL

The orderly process of discarding useless or unwanted material.

DNR

The Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources.

DUMP

A land site where solid waste is disposed of in a manner that does not protect the environment.

DWELLING UNIT

A place of habitation occupied by a normal single-family unit or a combination of persons who may be considered as equivalent to a single-family unit for the purposes of this article.

GARBAGE

Includes every refuse accumulation of animal, fruit or vegetable matter, liquid or otherwise that attends the preparation, use, cooking, dealing in, or storing of meat, fish, fowl, fruit or vegetables originally used for foodstuffs.

HAZARDOUS WASTE

Those wastes, such as toxic, radioactive or pathogenic substances, which require special handling to avoid illness or injury to persons or damage to property and the environment.

INDUSTRIAL WASTE

Waste material, except garbage, rubbish and refuse, directly or indirectly resulting from an industrial processing or manufacturing operation.

LITTER

Solid waste scattered about in a careless manner, usually rubbish.

NONRESIDENTIAL SOLID WASTE

Solid waste from agricultural, commercial, industrial or institutional activities.

PERSON

Individuals, firms, corporations and associations, and includes the plural as well as the singular.

PRIVATE COLLECTION SERVICES

Collection services provided by a person licensed to do the same by the DNR.

RECYCLABLE WASTE

Waste material that can be remanufactured into usable products and shall include, by way of enumeration but not by way of limitation, glass, plastics, newspapers, cardboard and metals (aluminum, steel, tin, brass, etc.).

REFUSE

Includes all waste material, including garbage, rubbish and industrial waste, and shall, by way of enumeration but not by way of limitation, include ash, boards, furniture or household appliances and bulky items.

REFUSE CARTS

Includes all carts that are approved and/or purchased from the Town of Cedarburg. The minimum refuse cart size shall be 35 gallons, with the maximum refuse cart size not to exceed 95 96 gallons.

REFUSE CONTAINERS

~~Includes most commercially available containers or plastic bags that have been specifically designed for handling refuse. The minimum refuse container size shall be five gallons, with the maximum refuse container size being 32 gallons. All refuse containers, except plastic bags, shall be equipped with handles and covers. Holes cut into the side of a container are not acceptable handles. No refuse container and contents shall weigh more than 50 pounds.~~

RESIDENTIAL SOLID WASTE

All solid waste that normally originates in a residential environment from residential dwelling units.

RESIDENTIAL UNIT

An individual household capable of independent habitation by a family unit. A single-family dwelling shall be considered to be one residential unit; a multifamily dwelling shall be considered to be multiple residential units, the number of residential units to equal the number of family units to be housed therein. Residential units shall not include boardinghouses, motels, resorts or bed-and-breakfasts.

RUBBISH

Includes combustible and noncombustible waste material, except rocks, concrete, bricks and similar solid materials, plaster or dirt that is incidental to the operation of a building, or recyclables.

SCAVENGING

The uncontrolled removal of materials at any point in solid waste management.

SHARPS

Needles, syringes with needles attached and disposable lancets.

SHOULDER

That part of the road right-of-way, normally gravel, that lies between the edge of pavement and the side of the ditch.

SOLID WASTE

Garbage, rubbish, refuse, and other useless, unwanted or discarded material from agricultural, residential, commercial, industrial or institutional activities. Solid waste does not include solid or dissolved material in domestic sewage. Solid waste includes opened dry latex paint cans which shall not be placed in a refuse container or cart, but shall be placed next to the refuse container or cart for collection.

STORAGE

The interim containment of solid waste in an approved manner after generation and prior to collection and ultimate disposal.

STORAGE AREAS

Areas where persons place containers during no collection days as well as areas where containers are set out on collection day.

§ 273-5. Refuse containers and carts.

A. General container standards. All refuse containers or carts shall be as described in § 273-3 of this article. They shall be maintained in a nuisance- and odor-free condition and shall be sufficient to prevent the scattering of contents by weather conditions or animals.

B. Approved containers. All garbage created, accumulated or produced shall be deposited in refuse containers or carts of a type approved by the Town.

~~(1) Current residents of the Town at the effective date of this article may use refuse containers or carts as described in § 273-3 of this article, until December 31, 2010. After this date, December 31, 2010, except as provided herein, only approved refuse carts shall be used by residents of the Town for the collection of refuse. No household may have more than three carts per residence. The following exceptions may apply to the requirements of using refuse carts:~~

~~(a) Plastic bags of not more than 32 gallons in size and its contents of refuse weighing less than 50 pounds will be collected as overflow if the bag is placed next to a full refuse cart; bulk items normally collected that do not fit in a cart will be collected or~~

~~(b) Residents with a permanent physical limitation or disability that make it unreasonably difficult or not possible to use a refuse cart for collection at a residential unit, and for whom no regular assistance with the refuse carts is available, may apply to the Director of Public Works for an exemption from the refuse cart requirement for the residential unit. However, if such exemption is granted the only other type of container that may be used is plastic bags of not more than 32 gallons in size and its contents of refuse weighing less than 50 pounds, subject to the size and weight limitations as provided hereinabove in Subsection B(1)(a).~~

(2) All newly constructed homes receiving occupancy permits after January 1, 2006, shall be required to purchase a refuse cart or carts as described in § 273-3. No household may have more than three carts per residence. Refuse not contained within the cart will not be collected, unless in compliance with Subsection B(1)(a) above or as otherwise permitted by this article.

(3) Any refuse carts purchased from the Town will be covered by the manufacturer's applicable warranty. Damage that occurs to the cart, either within or after the expiration of the applicable manufacturer's warranty, during normal refuse collection activities shall be repaired or replaced by the Town. If the refuse cart is damaged due to abuse, vandalism, unauthorized repair or alteration or failure due to natural calamities, such as fire, storm or high winds, it will be the homeowner's responsibility to have the cart repaired or replaced.

C. Householder to provide containers. It shall be the duty of every occupant, tenant and proprietor of any residential unit to purchase refuse containers or carts capable of holding all

garbage which would ordinarily accumulate on such premises between the times of successive collections.

D. Ashes. Cold, completely extinguished ashes shall be placed within a paper or plastic bag prior to depositing the ashes in a refuse container or cart.

E. Illegal containers. Containers or carts not approved consist of metal barrels and drums, wooden or cardboard barrels or boxes, wheelbarrows and other such containers not approved by this article. These containers will not be emptied regardless of contents or weight. After December 31, 2010, only approved refuse carts shall be considered legal containers for refuse collection as provided under Subsection B(1) above.

§ 273-6. Collection of refuse.

A. Placement for collection: residential.

(1) Residential solid waste shall be accessible to collection crews. All refuse and rubbish for collection shall be placed on a relatively level area in front of the premises adjacent to but not on the roadway. "Adjacent" for the purpose of this article shall mean no farther than 10 feet from the edge of the road pavement. Bulky wastes from residential units shall likewise be placed in neat, orderly fashion adjacent to the roadway. Carts shall be positioned with the lid opening facing the road. If multiple carts are placed at a single location, the carts shall be placed at least three(3) feet apart. During winter months, solid waste shall not be placed on top of the snow bank, nor shall it be placed in the roadway. The owner shall either shovel out an area on the shoulder of the road in which to place his refuse or he shall place it in his driveway. Collection crews and trucks will not collect residential solid waste unless it is placed in close proximity to the pavement of a public or private road street. Residential units shall bring their solid waste to the public right-of-way for collection; unless a written agreement exists with the Town for entry onto private property. Should collection crews be unable to discharge contents of refuse carts or refuse containers into collection vehicles using normal handing procedures, the carts or containers, including contents, will be left at curbroadside. The owner shall make provisions to assure that the solid waste therein can be collected on the scheduled collection day during the following week. Collection crews will not empty refuse carts by means other than automated dumping and refuse cans by manual dumping.

(2) Loose garbage and rubbish shall be placed in either refuse carts or refuse containers as described in § 273-3 of this article.

(3) All refuse carts and containers shall be maintained in a clean and structurally sound condition.

(4) Garbage and rubbish shall be placed in such a manner and the covers so affixed that no garbage or rubbish will be blown onto the adjacent pavement or surrounding ground.

(5) Emptied refuse carts and containers shall be removed from the roadside on the same day of collection. Items not taken by the collector, because they violate these regulations, shall also be removed the same day.

(6) Rubbish which cannot be feasibly placed in refuse carts or containers because of its bulky size shall be set out individually or in bundles of less than 50 pounds. Bulk and bundled items shall require a special pick up. Residents shall notify Town Hall of the special pick-up and pay all appropriate pick up and disposal fees, as listed in the Town Board approved fee schedule, prior to pick up of the bulk or bundled items.

(7) Bulky items, such as but not limited to refrigerators, washing machines and furniture, may be collected by the Town with equipment other than the compactor trucks. All bulky metal items and furniture shall require a special pickup sticker to be purchased at Town Hall prior to collection as described in par. 273-6 (A)(6).

(8) Branches, sticks and brush will not be collected as refuse. They shall be placed in a pile on the road side of the ditch near the driveway, if the resident wants the Town to chip them. After being notified by the resident, the Town will chip these branches, sticks or brush, haul the chips away and bill the resident, according to the current fee schedule. Roadside chipping shall be available from April 1st to October 15th each year.

B. Restrictions on time of placement.

(1) All refuse carts ~~and containers and all bundles of rubbish~~ shall be placed in collection locations as designated in Subsection A above only after 7:00 p.m. on the evenings prior to the regular collection day and prior to 6:30 a.m. on the scheduled day of collection. All refuse carts ~~and containers~~ for refuse and garbage disposal shall be removed from the roadside on the same day of collection unless the refuse is not collected due to unforeseeable circumstances, when it shall be collected the next day.

(2) In case of a holiday or extremely inclement weather, the collection will be made one day later than normally scheduled, unless notified otherwise. Any change in routing or scheduling not connected with holidays will be done so only after each occupant receives adequate notice of such change. (Holidays affecting garbage collection would be Memorial Day and Labor Day and the following if they would fall on a Monday, Tuesday or Wednesday: New Year's Day, Independence Day, Christmas Eve, Christmas Day and New Year's Eve.)

(3) Town employees, Town vehicles, or employees of licensed collectors will not enter any structures or enter onto private property to remove garbage or refuse, except by written agreement with the property owner.

(4) Items not taken by the collector because of size, weight, volume or packaging shall be removed the same day of collection, except that bulk and bundled items, metals and appliances, scheduled for special pick-up shall be left for pickup at a later date.

C. Placement for collection: commercial. Garbage and rubbish pickup from commercial and industrial sites will be limited to three refuse carts (maximum size of 95 ~~96~~ gallons) ~~or three thirty-two gallon refuse cans or equal~~ per week. Disposal of additional garbage and rubbish from these sites will be the responsibility of the occupant, who may contract with a commercial hauler for its removal.

§ 273-7. Prohibited activities and non-collectable materials.

A. Dead animal. It shall be unlawful to place any dead animal, or parts thereof, in a container for collection; provided, however, that this subsection shall not apply to animal parts from food preparation for human consumption.

B. Undrained food wastes. It shall be unlawful to place any garbage or other food waste in a container for collection unless it is first drained and wrapped.

C. Ashes. Cold, completely extinguished ashes contained within paper or plastic bags may be placed within a refuse container for collection.

D. Improper placement. It shall be unlawful to place, or allow to be placed, any solid waste upon the roads, streets, or public or private property within the Town contrary to the provisions of this article.

E. Compliance with article. It shall be unlawful to store, collect, transport, transfer, recover, incinerate or dispose of any solid waste within the boundaries of the Town contrary to the provisions of this article.

F. Improper transportation. It shall be unlawful to transport any solid waste in any vehicle which permits the contents to blow, sift, leak or fall there from. If spillage does occur, the collection crew shall immediately return spilled materials to the collection vehicle and shall properly clean, or have cleaned, the area. All vehicles used for the collection and transportation of solid waste shall be durable, easily cleanable and leak proof, if necessary, considering the type of waste and its moisture content. Collection vehicles shall be cleaned frequently to prevent nuisances and insect breeding and shall be maintained in good repair.

G. Interference with authorized collector. No person other than an authorized collector shall collect or interfere with any garbage after it shall have been put into a garbage receptacle and deposited in the proper place for the collector, nor shall any authorized person molest, hinder, delay or in any manner interfere with an authorized garbage collector in the discharge of his duties.

H. Scavenging. It shall be unlawful for any person to scavenge any solid waste placed for collection.

I. Private dumps. It shall be unlawful for any person to use or operate a dump.

J. Non-collectible materials. It shall be unlawful for any person to place for collection any of the following wastes:

- (1) Hazardous waste.
- (2) Toxic waste.
- (3) Chemicals.
- (4) Explosives or ammunition.
- (5) Drain or waste oil or flammable liquids.
- (6) Liquid paint.
- (7) Tires.
- (8) Liquid wastes (i.e., cooking oils).
- (9) Branches, sticks, leaves, logs or garden waste.

K. Animal or human wastes. It shall be unlawful for any person to place animal wastes and/or human wastes for collection, unless said wastes are placed in a sealed plastic bag.

L. Medical wastes. It shall be unlawful for any person to place for collection any pathogenic medical wastes. It shall be unlawful for any person to place sharps for collection. These items shall be disposed of at an approved sharps disposal facility.

M. Building waste. Rubbish from building construction, remodeling or razing will not be collected by the Town and must be disposed of by the building contractor or owner. Small amounts of lumber in stacks or bundles of less than 50 pounds will be collected as a special pick-up as described in chapter 273-6 (A)(6) if the wood is cut into four-foot lengths or less and placed out with the refuse. Small scraps of wood shall may be bagged and placed in the refuse container cart.

N. Stumps. Tree and/or shrub stumps will not be picked up by the Town.

O. Boulders, dirt and similar wastes. Boulders, dirt, ground, concrete, concrete blocks, stones, rocks, sod and similar heavy, dense waste will not be picked up by the Town. Such items shall be disposed of privately.

P. Sawdust and similar wastes. Sawdust and other fine, dry particulate matter or dust shall be picked up only if it is contained within ~~closed~~ sealed paper or plastic bags and placed within the refuse container ~~or cart~~.

§ 273-10. Recycling; use of composting structure.

A. Recyclable materials. It is unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to place, deposit or cause to be deposited for collection any materials defined as recyclable in Article III, Recycling, of this chapter. Refuse found to contain these materials will not be collected. ~~Containers or carts~~ found to be in violation of this subsection along with all other containers or carts at the commercial or residential dwelling unit will not be dumped.

B. Composting site. A composting structure is located at the Town materials yard. The Town shall not pick up grass clippings, leaves or other vegetation. Those who wish to dispose of their grass clippings, leaves, weeds and garden vegetation should deposit them in the Town composting structure.

C. The Town Recycling Center is located within the designated building south of the Town Hall and west of the Town Parking Lot adjacent to Washington Avenue. Town Residents ~~Persons~~ may use the Town Recycling Center for the sole purpose of depositing permitted recyclable materials on Thursday afternoons (noon to 6:00 p.m.) and Saturdays (9:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.), and at such other times as designated by the Town. Recyclable items shall be placed and/or deposited only in the areas assigned to the respective recyclable materials. No other materials may be deposited, placed or left at the Town Recycling Center. To promote the safe and orderly use of the Town Recycling Center, no other activities (business, personal, political or otherwise) shall take place at the Town Recycling Center and in the adjacent Town Parking Lot during the open hours of the Town Recycling Center. However, during the open hours of the Town Recycling Center, the Town Parking Lot shall also remain open for parking purposes only for persons who are attending to matters at the Town Hall.

§ 273-11. Use of Town materials yard.

A. What may be deposited. Any resident of the Town of Cedarburg may bring to the Town materials yard (that area adjoining the Town Hall and Town Garage and surrounded by a chain link fence) any metal, used oil, tires, grass clippings, leaves, weeds and garden vegetation which are generated from the resident's property in the Town of Cedarburg, but not brush, branches, sticks or stumps, and place these waste materials in the area assigned

for the respective materials. No other materials may be deposited in the Town materials yard. No metal deposited in the yard and no Town construction and maintenance materials, including topsoil, may be removed from the Town yard. Tires, ~~microwaves~~ and appliances containing Freon require payment of a drop-off fee prior to being deposited in the Town materials yard.

B. Unlawful use; identification sticker.

(1) It shall be unlawful for anyone who is not a Town resident to deposit waste material in the Town materials yard;

(2) It shall be unlawful for anyone to deposit any waste material, except those permitted by Town ordinance and/or signs and which shall only be waste materials generated in the Town of Cedarburg; and

(3) Any Town resident, before being authorized to enter the Town materials yard to deposit waste material permitted for disposal, must first apply for, obtain and permanently install on the window shield of his or her vehicle a Town of Cedarburg identification sticker. Each Town sticker shall be only used by the Town family to which it was issued and only for the vehicle to which it was assigned.

C. Fees for the pickup and disposal of metal items, white goods and appliances. Residents shall be charged a fee for the pickup and disposal of scrap metal items, white goods and appliances according to the fee schedule approved by the Town Board.

§ 273-20. Definitions.

For the purpose of this article, the following terms shall have the meaning indicated:

BIMETAL CONTAINER

A container for carbonated or malt beverages that is made primarily of a combination of steel and aluminum.

CONTAINER BOARD

Corrugated paperboard used in the manufacture of shipping containers and related products.

DROPOFF COLLECTION

A system for collecting recyclable materials in which the recyclable materials are taken by individuals to designated collection sites and deposited into designated containers from which the recyclable materials are processed and marketed.

FOAM POLYSTYRENE PACKAGING

Packaging made primarily from foam polystyrene that satisfies one of the following criteria:

A. Is designed for serving food or beverages.

B. Consists of loose particles intended to fill space and cushion the packaged article in a shipping container.

C. Consists of rigid materials shaped to hold and cushion the packaged article in a shipping container.

HAULER

A person, firm, partnership or corporation that collects solid waste or recyclables for storage, treatment, processing, marketing or disposal in the Town of Cedarburg.

HDPE

High-density polyethylene, labeled by the SPI Code No. 2.

LDPE

Low-density polyethylene, labeled by the SPI Code No. 3.

MAGAZINES

Magazines and other materials printed on similar glossy paper.

MAJOR APPLIANCE

A residential or commercial air conditioner, clothes dryer, clothes washer, dishwasher, freezer, microwave oven with capacitor, oven, refrigerator, stove, residential and commercial furnace, boiler, dehumidifier, and water heater.

MULTIPLE-FAMILY DWELLING

A property containing five or more residential units, including those which are occupied seasonally.

NEWSPAPER

A newspaper and other materials printed on newsprint.

NONRESIDENTIAL FACILITIES AND PROPERTIES

Commercial, retail, industrial, institutional and governmental facilities and properties.

This term does not include multiple-family dwellings.

OFFICE PAPER

High-grade printing and writing papers from offices in nonresidential facilities and properties. Printed white ledger and computer printout are examples of office paper generally accepted as high grade. This term does not include industrial process waste.

OTHER RESINS or MULTIPLE RESINS

Plastic resin labeled by the SPI Code No. 7.

PERSON

Any individual, corporation, partnership, association, local governmental unit, as defined in § 66.0131(1)(a), Wis. Stats., state agency or authority or federal agency.

PETE

Polyethylene terephthalate, labeled by the SPI Code No. 1.

PLASTIC CONTAINER

An individual, separate, rigid plastic bottle, can, jar or carton, except for a blister pack, that is originally used to contain a product that is the subject of a retail sale.

POST-CONSUMER WASTE

Solid waste other than solid waste generated in the production of goods, hazardous waste, as defined in § 291.01(7), Wis. Stats., waste from construction and demolition of structures, scrap automobiles, or high-volume industrial waste, as defined in § 289.01(17), Wis. Stats.

PP

Polypropylene, labeled by the SPI Code No. 5.

PS

Polystyrene, labeled by the SPI Code No. 6.

PVC

Polyvinyl chloride, labeled by the SPI Code No. 3.

RECYCLABLE MATERIALS

Includes lead acid batteries; major appliances; waste oil; yard waste; aluminum containers; corrugated paper or other container board; ~~foam polystyrene packaging~~; glass containers; magazines; newspaper; office paper; rigid plastic containers, including those made of PETE, HDPE, PVC, LDPE, PP, PS, and other resins or multiple resins; steel containers; waste tires; and bimetal containers, and consumer electronics.

RECYCLING CENTER

The Town building to the south of the Town Hall on Washington Avenue in the Town, the designated drop-off collection site, used exclusively for a recycling collection and storage facility.

SOLID WASTE

The meaning specified in § 289.01(33), Wis. Stats.

SOLID WASTE FACILITY

The meaning specified in § 289.01(35), Wis. Stats.

SOLID WASTE TREATMENT

Any method, technique or process which is designed to change the physical, chemical or biological character or composition of solid waste. "Treatment" includes incineration.

TOWN

As used herein, refers specifically to the Town of Cedarburg.

WASTE TIRE

A tire that is no longer suitable for its original purpose because of wear, damage or defect.

YARD WASTE

Leaves, grass clippings, and yard and garden debris. This term does not include brush, stumps, roots or shrubs with intact root balls. Editor's Note: Amended at time of adoption of Code (see Ch. 1, General Provisions, Art. II).

§ 273-21. Separation of recyclable materials.

Occupants of single-family and two- to four-unit residences, multiple-family dwellings and nonresidential facilities and properties shall separate the following materials from post-consumer waste:

- A. Lead acid batteries.
- B. Major appliances.
- C. Waste oil.
- D. Yard waste.
- E. Aluminum containers.
- F. Bimetal containers.
- G. Corrugated paper or other container board.
- H. ~~Foam polystyrene packaging.~~ Glass containers.
- I. ~~Glass containers.~~ Phone books.
- J. Magazines.
- K. Newspaper.
- L. Office paper.
- M. Rigid plastic containers made of PETE, HDPE, PVC, LDPE, PP, PS, and other resins or multiple resins.
- N. Steel containers.
- O. Waste tires.
- P. Consumer electronics.

§ 273-24. Lead acid batteries, major appliances, waste oil and yard waste.

Editor's Note: Amended at time of adoption of Code (see Ch. 1, General Provisions, Art. II). Occupants of single-family and two- to four-unit residences, multiple-family dwellings and nonresidential facilities and properties shall manage lead acid batteries, major appliances, waste oil, and yard waste as follows:

A. Lead acid batteries may be delivered to the Town Recycling Center.

B. Couches, furniture and other non-metal bulky items shall be picked up by the Town by special pick up as described in chapter 273-6 (A) (6). ~~provided that items are left at the garbage pickup location on the designated garbage pickup day.~~

C. Major appliances and other metal items may be picked up by the Town for an appliance/metal pickup fee as set forth in Chapter 273-6 (A)(6). ~~the Town schedule of fees.~~ Nonhazardous metal items may be dropped off at the Town of Cedarburg Drop-off Area for no charge. Hazardous metal items, including but not limited to microwaves, refrigerators, freezers, air conditioners and dehumidifiers, may be dropped off at the Town of Cedarburg Drop-off Area for an appliance drop-off fee as set forth in the Town schedule of fees.

D. Waste oil may be delivered to the Town of Cedarburg Drop-off Area and placed in the site specifically designated there for.

E. Yard waste shall be delivered to the Town of Cedarburg Drop-off Area and placed in the site specifically designated there for.

§ 273-25. Preparation and collection of recyclable materials.

Except as otherwise directed by the Town, occupants of single-family and multiple-family residences and nonresidential properties shall deliver or take the separated, prepared materials specified in § 273-21A through Q P to the Town Recycling Center where all such materials shall be separated by category either at the time of delivery or at the Recycling Center.

A. Aluminum containers: rinse thoroughly and dry.

B. Bimetal containers: rinse thoroughly and dry.

C. Corrugated paper or other container board shall be free of debris, ~~flattened, stacked and tied.~~

D. ~~Foam polystyrene packaging: place in closed plastic bags.~~ Glass containers: wash and rinse, remove plastic or metal, and all bottle caps, lids, and rings, and separate by color: clear, green, and brown..

E. ~~Glass containers: wash and rinse, remove plastic or metal, and all bottle caps, lids, and rings.~~ Phone books.

F. Magazines.

G. Newspaper: ~~bundle and place in paper bags (no string).~~

H. Office paper.

I. Rigid plastic containers as follows shall be prepared and delivered to the Town Recycling Center and placed in the approved recycling bins, after thoroughly rinsing:

(1) Plastic containers made of PETE shall be rinsed free of product residue and caps shall be removed and discarded, including milk jugs and detergent bottles.

(2) Plastic containers made of HDPE shall be free of product residue.

(3) Plastic containers made of PVC shall be free of product residue.

(4) Plastic containers made of LDPE shall be free of product residue.

(5) Plastic containers made of PP shall be free of product residue.

(6) Plastic containers made of PS shall be free of product residue.

(7) Plastic containers made of other resins or multiple resins shall be free of product residue.

J. Steel containers shall be rinsed free of product residue.

K. Waste tires shall be delivered to the Town of Cedarburg Drop-off Area for a per-tire disposal fee as set forth in the Town schedule of fees. Waste tires shall be deposited in the site specifically designated there for.

L. Consumer electronics shall be separated into 2 groups

(1) Computers, computer monitors, printers and peripherals, televisions, VCR's, DVD Players, fax machines, and any other video recording or playback device. A disposal fee as set forth in the Town schedule of fees shall be required for all televisions.

(2) All other consumers electronics not included in par. 1.

§ 273-30. Ownership of recyclable materials and refuse.


Editor's Note: Amended at time of adoption of Code (see Ch. 1, General Provisions, Art. II). Recyclable materials and refuse, upon delivery to the Town of Cedarburg Recycling Center and Drop-off Area, shall become the property of the Town of Cedarburg. Recyclable materials, upon collection by any permitted collector, shall become the property of the contractor. Scavenging and removal of recyclables deposited in the recycling center or yard shall not be permitted.
